Advanced Ethics

This elective builds upon the introductory ethics course by exploring some of the ethical challenges engineers face in the industry. In particular, the seminar will focus on conflicts of duties, and through a Socratic process of discussion, help students develop clarity about their own ethical priorities. The seminar will feature an extended case study of the design and construction of the BP Deepwater Horizon oil rig, focusing on engineering decisions that compromised safety for cost savings that led to both fatalities to one of the worst environmental disasters in American history.
